Many of the pieces were created around 1995 for the 35th anniversary and have been added to in December 2010 as part of the 50th anniversary celebrations of ITV's flagship programme.



Much of the artwork is based on the Victorian terraced houses which form one side of the street, and I guess it is safe to say that my interest in the actual Street stems from my own work as a local historian in my hometown of Houghton-le-Spring in Co Durham. Who can't help but be curious about those little houses and the lives of the people that live in them?

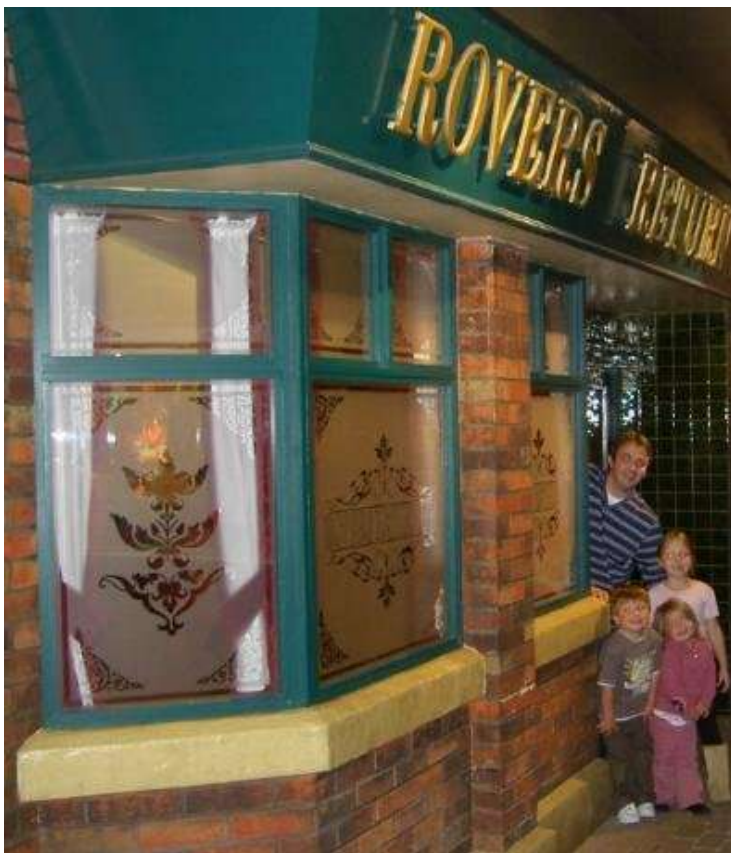


ABOUT PAUL LANAGAN
